Early in the nineteenth century an interesting little guidebook was published in London. Its undated title-page was followed by a dated *Advertisement*, or introduction, and the later editions were mostly the same. It was compiled by John Feltham and included some small maps and a series of sixteen miniature ones, all about 125 x 75 mm:

Bath and Bristol; Worthing Little Hampton and Great Bognor; Brighton and Eastbourne; Clifton and Hot Wells; Buxton and Matlock; Cheltenham; Isle of Wight; Sidmouth Exmouth Dawlish Teignmouth and Shaldon; Harrowgate; Hastings; Margate Broadstairs and Ramsgate; Scarborough; Southampton; Tenby including Milford Haven and the Island of Caldy; Tunbridge Wells; Weymouth and Portland.
