

A scarce pocket directory of Paris about 140 x 90 mm., is illustrated with forty-eight numbered plans of quartiers, which are tipped in facing the appropriate page in the text. Opposite the start of the entry for 'arrondissemens' is a small folding key plan of the city, indicating the twelve arrondissemens and their quartiers. At the rear of the book, which was published in 1832, is a small folded *Plan de Paris*, signed 'Couché fils dir. Kardt sculp.' However, the British Library copy has printed blue limp covers which are dated MDCCCXXXIII.





This directory was the work of prolific cartographer Aristide-Michel Perrot and these elegant plans of quartiers are the fourth of his seven sets of miniatures. All are borderless and unsigned with their titles, page number and plate number at the head of the page. The rear folding plan was replaced by two new ones in the later revised editions. These are much thicker volumes because they are printed on thicker paper.
