
The first book by Harriet Beecher Stowe, of *Uncle Tom's cabin* fame, was published before she was married and was written with her sister Catharine. It was so popular that there were five issues in 1833 but is now a rare item. It measured only about four inches square and is clearly a close copy of an earlier work (see 1829).



At the end of the book there are eleven wood engraved maps and just the one of Asia is signed in the border at top left: E. Martin Sc. Their titles are above the maps:

Western States; Eastern States; Southern States; United States; North America; South America; Europe; Asia; Africa; The World (Western Hemisphere); The World (Eastern Hemisphere).
