C.F. Julius Jaeger



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The cartographic output of Carl Friedrich Julius Jaeger includes three miniature atlases, all about the same size. The first of these relates to the Netherlands, the second to Europe (see 1843a) and the third is a world atlas (see 1856).




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The atlas of the Netherlands contains thirteen lithographic maps about 110/115 x 75/80 mm. usually with outline hand colour:

Nederlanden, Limburg en Luxemburg; Provincie Noord Brabant; Provincie Gelderland; Provincie Holland Zuiderdeel; Provincie Holland Noorderdeel; Provincie Zeeland; Provincie Utrecht; Provincie Vriesland; Provincie Overijssel; Provincie Groningen; Provincie Drenthe; Provincie Limburg; Groot-Hertogdom Luxemburg.

This atlas measures 90 x 130 mm. and there were four editions published, each with a different title. A facsimile of the last edition appeared in 1994.
