

Sunday school cards were designed to teach children various aspects of Christianity and at least one set was devoted to scriptural geography. This consists of twelve cards, about 110×70 mm., engraved on steel and signed by R. Lowe. They have hand-colour on all but the one featuring the Ten Commandments and include seven with maps or plans:

The World showing the primitive settlements of the descendants of Noah; Mesopotamia including the East illustrative of the history of Abraham, Isaac & Jacob; Journeyings and encampments of the Israelites from Egypt to Canaan; Plan of the City of Jerusalem; Land of Moriah or Environs of Jerusalem; Judea or Palestine illustrating the history of the New Testament and exhibiting the travels of the Lord Jesus Christ.

There is also an untitled pictorial map showing the great road to Jericho, with a key to six significant places. At the foot of each card is the imprint: 'Entered According To Act Of Congress In The Year 1850 By A. C. Beaman In The Clerks Office In The District Court Of Mass.' They came in a slip-case of 115 x 75 mm. dimensions, with a title-label in a contrasting colour pasted on the front.
