



Sunday school cards were designed to teach children various aspects of Christianity and at least one set was devoted to scriptural geography. This consists of twelve cards, about 110 x 70 mm., engraved on steel and signed by R. Lowe. They have hand-colour on all but the one featuring the Ten Commandments and include seven with maps or plans:

*The World showing the primitive settlements of the descendants of Noah; Mesopotamia including the East illustrative of the history of Abraham, Isaac & Jacob; Journeyings and encampments of the Israelites from Egypt to Canaan; Plan of the City of Jerusalem; Land of Moriah or Environs of Jerusalem; Judea or Palestine illustrating the history of the New Testament and exhibiting the travels of the Lord Jesus Christ.*

There is also an untitled pictorial map showing the great road to Jericho, with a key to six significant places. At the foot of each card is the imprint: 'Entered According To Act Of Congress In The Year 1850 By A. C. Beaman In The Clerks Office In The District Court Of Mass.' They came in a slip-case of 115 x 75 mm. dimensions, with a title-label in a contrasting colour pasted on the front.
