
A scarce early French work with descriptive text by Antoine Du Pinet, includes forty-two woodcut illustrations, which are listed by Mireille Pastoureau in *Les Atlas français XVIe* -

These maps, plans and views 'de l'Europe, Asie & Afrique, que des Indes, & terres neuves', are of various shapes and sizes. Many have the imprint of the publisher Jean d'Ogerolles and about half of them relate to France and Italy.



- a view of Constantinople;
- a bird's-eye view of Cairo.
