

Between 1600 and 1604 Matthias Quad (1557-1613) wrote a series of five travel guides for which he then engraved several sets of plates, mostly miniature ones (115/140 x 90/100 mm.). The first of these books relates to France and is illustrated with thirty maps, increasing to thirty two in the second edition of 1603:

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Quad's next guidebook and all the later ones were published at Oberursel near Frankfurt by Cornelius Sutorius (Schuster). This differed from the other four he wrote which related to individual countries: France, Germany, Italy and Spain. It ranged much more widely through Europe and the Middle East and the forty two plates he engraved to illustrate it were for the most part larger ones, pretty well filling the page. The number increased to forty five in the second edition, issued under his pseudonym Cyprianus Eichovius. However, this series did include eleven miniature maps:

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Quad's *Deliciae Germaniae*, published at Cologne in 1600, has only two folding maps. However, he engraved a set of thirty plates for his 1602 guidebook to Germany. Two years later a new edition, with a different title and using his pseudonym Cyprianus Eichovius, had forty four plates but lacked six from the first edition: *Artesia; Hannonia; Westphalia; Hungaria; Brabantia; Geldria*.

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On the title-page of the fourth of his travel guides, Quad used the pseudonym Cyprianus Eichovius for the first time. This volume related to Italy and included an atlas of twenty four maps, which he engraved in similar size and style to the previous plates:

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The fifth and last of these guidebooks was also issued using the pseudonym Cyprianus Eichovius and relates to Spain and Portugal. It contains just ten maps:

*Galitia Galizia; Granata Regnum; Guipus coa Guipuzcua; Hispalenis conventus delinatio; Hispania Espania; Andalusia; Aragonia Arragon; Castilia; Portugallia; Valentia Regnum.*
