


Although seemingly intended for publication in 1660, Pierre Du Val's atlas of Louis XIV's territorial gains was probably delayed until 1663. No edition dated 1660 has been traced but the earliest one known has an engraved title-page dated 1663, with the figure '3' being changed from '0'. The engraving is poorly executed so that the figure could easily be mistaken for '9'.



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The twenty-three double-page maps and plans are about 120/5 x 100/5 mm. Only six are signed which is rather unusual. It seems illogical but some copies of the first edition have two additional plates at the rear relating to Swedish acquisitions. These are from his *La Géographie universelle* (see 1660): *Les Acquisitions de la Suede, en Alemagne, par la Paix de Munster* and *Les Acquisitions de la Suede Sur le Danemarq* The atlas includes various tables which differ between editions and one of them has the signature of Françoise de Lapointe, who is thought to have engraved many of Du Val's miniature plates. One of the maps is dated 1659, four are 1660, another is dated 1661 and two more are 1662. All these were removed in the second edition, which has no date on the title-page either.

In 1667 this work became the second part in Du Val's quartet of little books on the France of Louis XIV, with an additional dated title-page (see 1659). Also in 1667 the number of maps was reduced to fourteen* and text was introduced too. In 1677 a foliate border and date were added to the original title-page. In 1679 'd'Aix-la-chapelle, de Nimmegue.' was added to the end of the subtitle and one map† had its title extended: 'par la Paix des Pyrennées.'
