Christoph Riegel

Christoph Riegel published various pocket gazetteers which he illustrated with views of towns and cities, including some bird's-eye plans. The plates are all of similar shape and size, about 110 x 60 mm., although some had keys either above or below their single-line borders. They were not printed within the text but inserted between the pages of these thick little books.

The number of illustrations varied between the guides. One of them, which he first published in 1686, related to Germany and contained a series of 120 plates, including just twenty-one bird's-eye town plans:

Baden; Bamberg; Biberach; Bremen; Erfurt; Franckfurt an der Oder; Görlitz; Grätz; Kempten; Königsberg; Lauingen; Leipzig; Lindau; Memmingen; Münster; Saltzburg; Schafhausen; Stetin; Stuttgart; Thonauwerth; Zittau.
