An edition of Pierre Du Val's *La Géographie universelle* (see 1660) was published in Lyons in 1688 by Jean Certe. However, this work only contained seven maps: a small one of the world by Nicolas Auroux and six miniature ones about 120 x 100 mm. and signed 'M. Ogier fecit'. Matthieu Ogier was a Lyons engraver who produced various small maps to illustrate books published in the city. They included these six plates for Certe, which were close copies of Du Val's originals and retained his signature after their titles:

Terres arctiques; Terres antarctiques; Amerique; Afrique; Asie; Europe.

In 1712 Certe published a second edition which included the same plates but he added five new ones. These were also close copies of the Du Val originals, retaining his signature after their titles, but unlike the others, they were unsigned by the engraver:

La France; Le Royavme d'Espagne; L'Italie; Allemagne; Isles Britanniques.
