


The second miniature atlas of Tomás López followed soon after his first one (see 1757a) and related to the Seven Years War. As it contains a plan of a battle on 6th May 1757, it must have been published after this date and may have been issued before that of Louis Denis (see 1757), which was engraved in October of that year.



The atlas contains a plan of Prague with a key, a map of Bohemia, sixteen regional maps and a battle plan. The plates are about 85 x 105 mm. and printed on the rectos, with a facing page of letterpress. The borders are usually coloured, the map of Bohemia having full body colour and the rest just in outline, but the plans plain. With the exception of the battle plan, they are all signed 'Por Lopez 1757' under their titles:

*Plano de Praga; Carta general de la Bohemia; Circulos de Praga y Schlan; Circulo de Rakonitz; Circulo de Saatz; Circulo de Leitmeritz; Circulo de Buntzel; Circulo de Konizingrätz; Circulo de Chrudim; Circulo de Czaslau; Circulo de Bechin; Circulo de Kaurzim; Circulo de Moldau; Circulo de Prachen; Circulo de Beraun; Circulo de Pilsen; Circulos de Elnbogen y de Egra; Distrito de Crumau; Plano de la batalla dada el dia 6 de Mayo 1757 cerca de Praga.*
