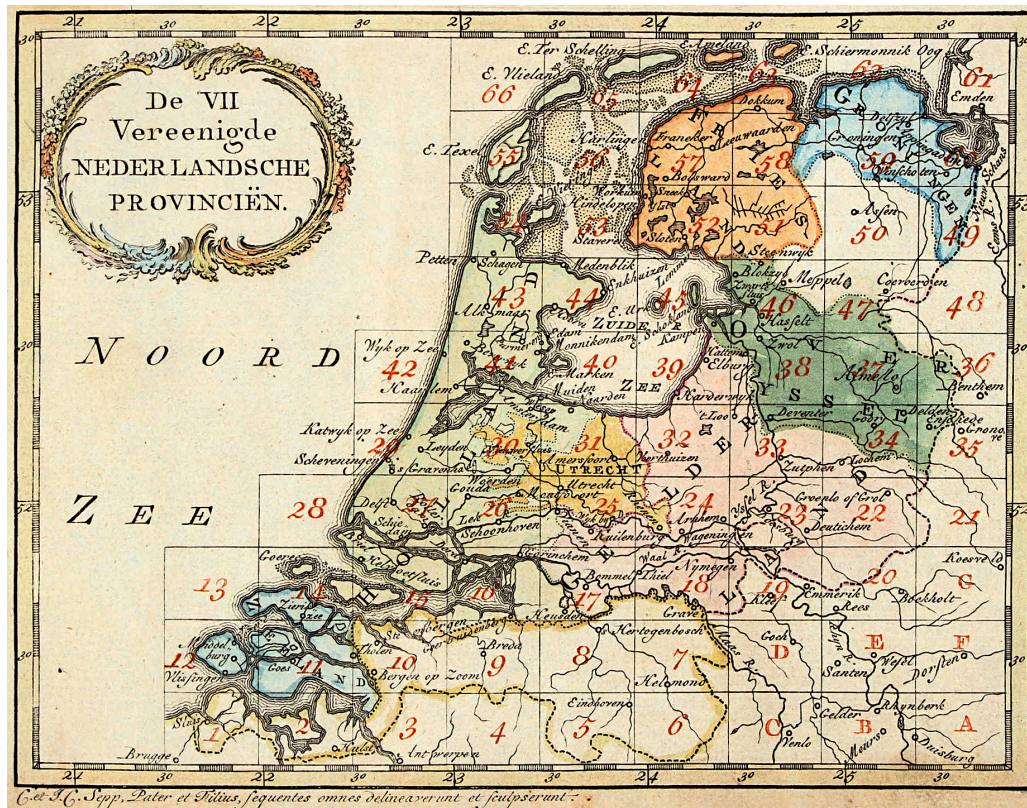

Christiaan A. & Jan C. Sepp

Jan Christiaan Sepp (1739-1811), who was the son of Christiaan Andreas Sepp (see 1758b & 1794), published a pocket atlas of the Netherlands in 1773. This contains 132 pages of text and seventy-four coloured maps, each measuring about 135/7 x 101/4 mm., which were also sold as a wall map.

All of them were drawn and engraved by father and son. 'C. et J.C. Sepp, Pater et Filius, sequentes omnes delineaverunt et sculpservunt' is engraved below the bottom border of the index map (see above).

The rest of the maps are untitled sectional ones, each having a number or letter outside the border near the top right corner: 1-66 and A-G. These also occur outside the borders of each map as keys to the adjacent ones (see below).

Two facsimile editions have been published: Alphen aan den Rijn, Atrium, 1987 and Weesp, Robas, 1992.
