

Jan Christiaan Sepp (1739-1811), who was the son of Christiaan Andreas Sepp (see 1758b & 1794), published a pocket atlas of the Netherlands in 1773. This contains 132 pages of text and seventy-four coloured maps, each measuring about $135/7 \times 101/4$ mm. All of them were drawn and engraved by father and son.

'C. et J.C. Sepp, Pater et Filius, sequentes omnes delineaverunt et sculpserunt' is engraved below the bottom border of the index map, which is titled *De VII Vereenigde Nederlandsche Provinciën*. The rest of the maps are untitled sectional ones, each having a number or letter outside the border near the top right corner: 1-66 and A-G. These also occur outside the borders of each map as keys to the adjacent ones.

Facsimile editions were published in 1987 and 1992.
