Charles Smith's work was of a very high standard, rivalling that of John Cary. His pocket atlas of the roads from London to Brighton, published in May 1800, was reminiscent of Cary's London to Falmouth one of sixteen years earlier (see 1784).

This uncommon small volume of about 155 x 105 mm. is usually found with contemporary hand-colour. It contains twenty six numbered single page road maps about 87 x 133 mm., engraved by Edward Jones and Benjamin Smith of Pentonville, London.
