

A bound set of cards constitutes an unusual miniature atlas of the whole of Britain, with the emphasis on railway lines. The accession date of the British Library copy is 1852. There are thirty-two numbered cards for England and Wales plus fourteen separately numbered ones for Scotland, making a total of forty-six altogether with each section having its own title-page. The maps, which are 53/4 x 76/7 mm., are sectional lithographic transfers from a plate of Great Britain engraved by Joshua Archer, many with more than one county per card:
