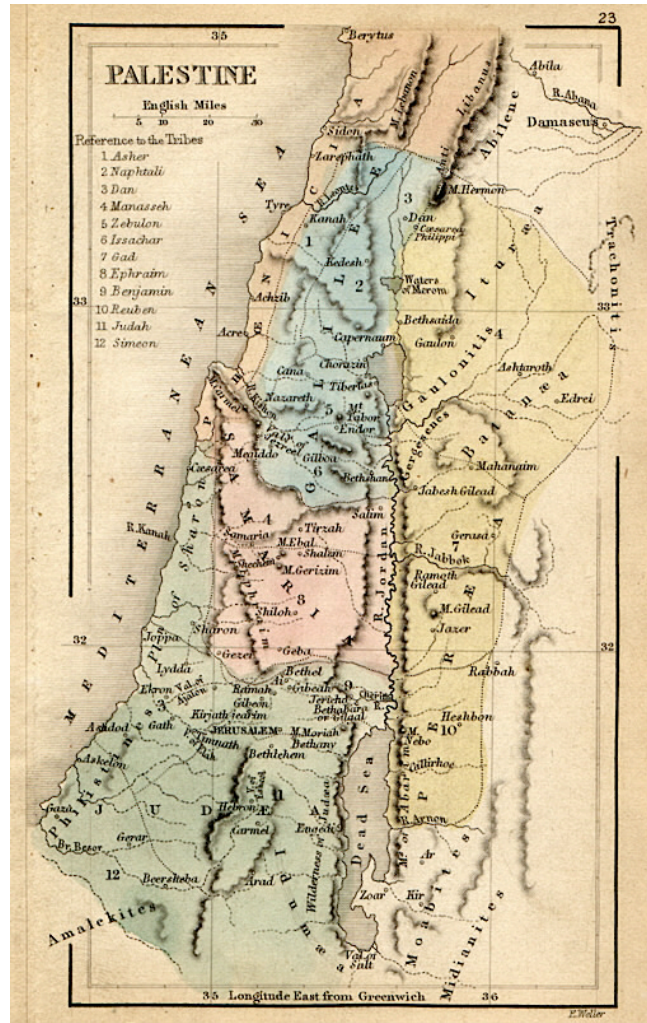


Walter McLeod was a headmaster and the author of several works including two pocket atlases about 150 x 100 mm. (see also 1856a). The first of these contained twenty-nine numbered maps finely engraved by Edward Weller. These were tinted lithographs, mostly single-page and about 70 x 130 mm. The one of England was not a miniature, being more than twice this size, and four were smaller being two to a page.*
