
First copyrighted in 1854, a small world geography book published in New York was reissued many times, with the pages increasing from sixty-two to sixty-eight. The work was written by James Monteith 'on the plan of object teaching' and was 'designed for beginners'. It had decorated printed covers, 175 x 130 mm. and in the text were thirteen wood engraved maps usually with hand-colour:

Map of the World; Western Hemisphere; Eastern Hemisphere; North America; Map of the United States; Eastern States; Middle States; Southern States; Western States; South America; Europe; Map of Asia; Africa.



The world map was only  $60 \times 40$  mm. but the other twelve were about  $100 \times 140$  mm. The book was issued again in the twentieth century.
