Edwin Hodder (1837-1904) was the author of many books including a three volume one on the cities of the world. It was seemingly issued in ten fascicules per volume: January to September 1882 for the first; October 1882 to July 1883 for the second; August 1883 to May 1884 for the third. The work includes many and varied illustrations including maps and plans, twenty-three of which are miniatures printed within the text. With the exception of a map of New Zealand, these are all plans of cities. Their dimensions are about 140 x 100 mm. with the exception of the three noted below. Four\* have their titles on the maps but the rest appear below them, with the wording 'Plan of ...':

Volume 1: Amsterdam\* (101 x 76 mm.); Rotterdam\* (102 x 77 mm.); Boston; Vienna.
Volume 2: San Francisco; Rouen; Madrid\*; Cairo; Toronto; Quebec; Marseilles;
Nuremberg; St. Petersburg; Pekin (117 x 128 mm.); Lyons; Chicago.
Volume 3: Athens; Philadelphia; Moscow; Rome; Berlin; New Zealand\*; Geneva.

Hodder's work was later reissued, but with an additional fourth volume relating to Great Britain and Ireland. However, this was not by him and contained no plans.
