

The Bradstreet Company eventually published a successor to its lovely little pocket atlas (see 1878), still with the Edward Gibbon quotation on its title-page: 'All that is human must retrograde if it do not advance.' It is slightly larger in size, 145 x 100 mm., with its scope extended a little and the quality again very high. This new atlas contains sixty-three maps, the first being a chart on two pages, as in some issues of the earlier work:

Many of these new maps, measuring 127×84 mm., have the imprint of C. Bradley and L.L. Coates, engravers of New York. They are chromolithographs printed on the recto of good quality paper as before, but with their titles now in panels and on the facing page is printed general and business information relating to each state.
